# "THE BIG SPRING SALE" -- Last Week In April

The Big Spring sale is currently scheduled for the **last week in April**. As of this writing, the library will be closed on Sundays through at least the beginning of April. We will provide final sale dates as the year progresses. Please make sure you are on our emailing list, check our website, or follow us on social media for updates!

New to our big sale? This is our largest one, typically held twice a year at Reston Regional. We offer 35-40,000 items, in over 20 categories. There are NO children's books at these sales. We recommend small kids take a pass on this one; it's quite big, there are books under the tables, and shoppers set aside large bags and baskets in a lot of the small spaces.

Scanners are allowed at this sale, but not in all areas. Quantities in some sections may be limited. Additional guidelines are provided at the sale to make it safe and pleasant for all. We will ask shoppers to leave if they can't play nice.

# LIBRARY NEWS – TEMPORARY CHANGE IN LIBRARY HOURS

**Beginning Sunday, January 16**, and effective through April 1, all regional and community Fairfax County Public Library (FCPL) branches will be **closed every Sunday and Monday**, and will keep their regular hours Tuesday through Saturday.

The current surge in COVID-19 cases and a high number of staff vacancies necessitated this change in hours. You can read the full announcement from the County on their website:


## **WE GET LETTERS!**

#### **In-Kind Donations**

Build and maintain relationships with area vendors to secure donations of food and supplies for FRRL activities. Pick up donations at local businesses and deliver to the library.

# **Publicity incl. Social Media**

Writing newsletters and announcements, designing and printing materials such as flyers, bookmarks, brochures. Regularly scheduled and ad hoc postings on social media advertising sales and other news. *Experience with mass e-mailings, newsletters, and social media for other organizations can be helpful.* 

#### **Event Volunteers**

Generating community awareness of the library and the work the Friends do to support it. Interact with the public, Friends, and Library staff. Volunteer at events inside and outside the library branch, such as Farmers Market, author talks, etc. *Experience with community orgs (Girl/Boy Scouts, info fairs, etc.) or customer relations can helpful*.

To renew or apply online, please fill out an online donation form at our website. There is no separate "membership" form or page, so please <u>click here to go to our general Donations page and then take</u> the following steps:

- 1. Once you're there, click on the DONATE button.
- 2. To enroll (or renew), click on the amount you want to donate and the payment method you want to use. Annual Membership is \$15 (\$5 for Seniors 65 and over). When you donate at least these amounts, you're automatically entered into our rolls.
- 3. On the next page that appears, there will be a field near the top of the donation page that says, "Add a note" or "Write a note" (depending on which payment method you select). In that space, please indicate the following:
  - Is this a RENEWAL or NEW MEMBERSHIP?
  - Your mailing address (if you want us to have it)
  - Your email address (if you want us to have it) we do not share your information with outside organizations!

Email and mailing addresses are used to provide notice of upcoming sales and FRRL events. We do not share our mailing list with other organizations and we do not receive any contact information from the Fairfax County Public Library or its internal mailing lists.

# **WAYS TO GIVE -- BOOK DONATION FAQS**

The Friends are happy to accept donations of books in very good, saleable condition! We want to find a home for your books, but we have to be able to store and sell them. Generally, the Friends accept donations at the library from **10am to 3pm**, any day the branch is open, except Wednesdays. We limit donations to **2 bags or small boxes** per household per day. Please NO books with highlights, underlining, torn pages, water, mildew, animal, or smoke damage.

Please review our Frequently Asked Questions below before you bring your donations to the library!



What do you do with donated books? First, we identify any books from the Library's wish list and pass those on directly to the library. We process the rest for sale at one of our sales. Unsold books after our sales are offered to other Friends groups.

Can I leave donations at the library if the library is closed or if the sign says donations are closed? Nope. Unattended boxes will be tossed due to safety concerns.

Are there specific times of year when donations are closed? We close when space is not available, when we are prepping for or recovering from our big sales, and from mid-December to early January, to give our volunteers a holiday. We never accept donations on days the library is closed.

#### What books do you take?

- New books, Best sellers, coffee-table
- · Art, Architecture, History, Philosophy, Science
- · Books for Young Adults, Children, and Educators
- Collectible books, Antiquarian items, prior to 1950
- Cookbooks (very recent or favorite classics)
- Non-English Books: Non-fiction only; educational books such as dictionaries, language learning, "Berlitz", etc.
- General Magazines--Prior to 1960 or < 3 months old
- Good condition Puzzles or Games (all the pieces!) give to librarians at desk
- Media—CDs, DVDs, Audio books on CD; Great Courses
- Recent (typically last 5 years) Educational books, Text books, Test-Prep materials (no high school or college foreign language text books, please)
- Specialty Magazines--up to 12 months old (e.g., Architectural Digest or Saveur)

#### What books won't you take?

- NO VHS tapes, audio cassettes, or phonograph / vinyl records
- NO Self-Help/Medical more than 3 years old
- NO Travel Books more than 3 years old
- NO maps, atlases, TripTiks, etc.
- NO National Geographic, Smithsonian, oversized magazines, or free/membership magazines (AARP, AAA, etc.)
- NO Remainders from yard sales, rummage sales, etc.

Why don't you take National Geographics (or this other thing that I love?) They are awesome! Sorry. We don't have room to take all the awesome things.

**Are my donations tax deductible?** Contributions are tax deductible to the extent allowed by law. Donations cannot be reclaimed or returned. Please check your donations carefully. FRRL is not responsible for misplaced items.
