Even as branch buildings are closed, FCPL continues to support patrons with a wide variety of free resources. Here are just some of the great things available.

Learn Something New (or Refresh Something You Already Know)

Take Classes Online through the Library – If you have a Fairfax County library card you have access to more than 500 courses online through [Universal Class](#). Classes cover everything from math and science to parenting and “how to” projects. [Learning Express](#) is another library-supported resource that offers online test prep, career support and other success-oriented resources for users.

Don’t have a library card? No problem! [Sign up for a card online now](#) and have immediate access to this and all of the library’s resources. You can finalize the application process later.

Find Your Next Big Read

Access Books, Magazines and Audio Resources Online – [Overdrive](#) allows county library users the ability to access hundreds of books and audiobooks for free without having to step foot in a physical library. [Look online](#) to see what’s available, and to learn how to use Libby or other apps to access materials on your phone or computer. [Magazines are also available to read online](#) thanks to the Library’s partnership with RB Digital.

Join a Virtual Book Club – Join a [virtual book club or discussion group](#) through the Fairfax County Public Library. Meet authors virtually too. Participate in the national, [Big Library Read](#) where readers talk about the same book.

CELEBRATING JOAN BISSELL, FAIRFAX COUNTY LIBRARIAN FOR OVER 40 YEARS

In early January, the Friends joined RRL staff in celebrating Joan Bissell as she retired after more than 40 years as a librarian for Fairfax County Public Library. A party was held in Joan’s honor, with library staff, administration, friends, family, and other guests from throughout the County coming to wish her a happy retirement. The Friends contributed to the event itself, as well as honoring Joan with a donation to the Reston Museum at Lake Anne Plaza, including a commemorative brick in Joan’s name. The brick is scheduled to be installed on the Plaza this year and will serve as a permanent reminder of her many years of service to our community.

Joan’s service to FCPL took her to multiple locations throughout the county over more than 40 years, but the bulk of her time was spent in Reston. Her first posting in Reston was in 1966 at Reston’s very first library, Carter Glass, which was located at Lake Anne in the building which is now the Reston Museum. Joan also worked at the mini-library at Hunters Woods Plaza in 1974, before moving to the current facility on Bowman Towne Drive in 1985. Joan worked at our current facility from opening day until December 2019, and supported our community through much growth and change over the last three decades. After so many years of devoted service, Joan now looks forward to a life of travel, adventure, and, of course, catching up on her reading!

RESTON FRIENDS BY THE NUMBERS



FRIENDS OF THE RESTON REGIONAL LIBRARY SUPPORT THE COALITION TO EXPAND LIBRARY ACCESS

As many of you are aware, Friends groups across the County (including ours) have united behind the Coalition to Extend Library Access (CELA), a grass-roots initiative to increase library funding, and specifically to include expanded and consistent hours at all libraries across Fairfax County.

The initiative saw some initial success. The County Executive presented his FY21 advertised budget on 2/25, and **all** of the Library's requests were included in this draft version, including the elimination of fines on children's materials, a new full-time Behavioral Health Specialist position to serve as the library's internal social services support, and full funding for Phase 1 of expanded and consistent Library hours.

Unfortunately, this budget was presented just a week prior to the lockdowns associated with the pandemic, and the County quickly retreated from many initiatives in a budget revision, including this one. Our hope is that economic recovery will be relatively swift and that the Library will see increases within the next year or two. The good news is that the initiative gained clear support from the County executives, CFO, and the community at large -- thanks in part to the Friend's efforts to publicize it and make their support known.

If it is eventually approved as part of an adopted budget package, FCPL currently envisions implementing it at Phase 1 libraries by the end of that calendar year. Phase 1 branches are all of the regionals plus Kingstowne, Kings Park and Patrick Henry. The new expanded and consistent hours will be Monday-Wednesday 10-9 and Thursday-Sunday 10-6. Phase 2 would encompass most of the remaining libraries in the second year of implementation.

You can help by letting your Supervisor know you support this initiative, continuing to help the Friends "spread the word" (but not the virus!) to other members of the community, and attending your local budget hearings once they resume (wear a CELA sticker if you go -- they will be available in the sorting room once the library reopens).
